- B. The Merced Division's draft response to a request for systemwide review of proposed revisions to APM Policy Sections 278 and 210-6 related to the Health Sciences Clinical Professor series. This is the second systemwide review of APM 278 and 210-6. Last year, the proposed revisions were considered as part of a package of APM changes. The results of that review are <a href="here">here</a>. As <a href="Vice Provost Carlson's letter states">Vice Provost Carlson's letter states</a>, this second systemwide review is intended to resolve prior discussions and answer remaining questions. - C. Calls for nominations for Senate Awards. The <u>Call for Nomination</u> for each of the <u>Senate's</u> <u>eight awards</u> has been revised, as per cover letters, including to be consistent with one another. All revisions have been approved by respective committees.
- III. Consultation with the Chancellor: Framework for UC's Growth & Shape Chair Amussen
  UCOP has launched the Framework project to identify the direction and resources needed to sustain the University as a world-class public research university into the future. The immediate next phase of the project is to develop at least two scenarios for UC Merced describing enrollment in 2040 and related resourcing needs. Associate Chancellor Klotzbier and Assistant Vice Chancellor Mendez will also be in attendance.

**Action requested:** 1) Discuss criteria to inform scenario development. 2) Confirm next steps, including date and time for March discussion of draft scenarios.

IV. FWAF Principles for Start-up and Incidental Funds – FWAF Chair Beaster-Jones

DivCo is asked to discuss CoR's contributions to the discussion on start-up and incidental funds, and to consider the implications for FWAF's principles to guide decision making on these topics.

FWAF's principles were revised on 12/8 following DivCo's discussion on 12/1.

**Action Requested:** 1) Discuss the FWAF principles in light of CoR's contribution. 2) Determine next steps.

## V. Campus Review Items

## A. Policy on Access to Student Data - CoR Chair Noelle

DivCo is asked to discuss committee comments on the proposed <u>Policy on Access to Student Data</u>. This new campus policy applies to all UC Merced employees and others using and disposing of university resources. The policy describes the conditions, and establishes procedures, under which student data may be distributed by Institutional Research and

Decision Support (IRDS) and the Office of the Registrar. UGC, GC, and CoR were the lead committees for this review.

**Action Requested:** 1) Discuss committee comments. 2) Transmit Divisional Council's response to the UC Merced Office of Campus Climate and Compliance.

#### **Committee Comments:**

- <u>CAPRA</u> endorsed the establishment of clear protocol and process for obtaining student data, and encouraged resources be provided to the appropriate parties to facilitate timely dissemination of these data.
- <u>Cor</u> identified three issues for consideration 1) the policy should explicitly address
  data requests from graduate groups and/or the Academic Senate, noting that these
  bodies differ from generic "faculty"; 2) clarify the policy as relates to data for
  research purposes; 3) clarify language related to restrictions on reporting
  aggregated data for small numbers of students.
- <u>UGC</u> supports the proposed procedures for access to student data.

Committees that declined to comment, but appreciated the opportunity to opine: CAP, CRE, D&E, FWAF, and GC.

## VI. Systemwide Review Items

A. Presidential Policy BFB – G-28, Travel Regulations - FWAF Chair Beaster-Jones
DivCo is asked to discuss committee comments on the proposed revisions to the
Presidential Policy Business and Finance Bulletin (BFB) – G-28, Travel Regulations. The
revisions are intended to make systemwide policy more "family friendly," by allowing
reimbursement, in limited circumstances, for travel (including childcare) expenses for
spouses, domestic partners, dependent-care providers, and dependents of employees
traveling on University business and candidates for employment at the University of
California traveling to UC locations for recruitment purposes. D&E and FWAF were the lead
committees for this review.

**Action Requested:** 1) Discuss committee comments. 2) Transmit Division Council's response to systemwide Senate Chair Chalfant by February 15, 2017.

**Committee Comments:** <u>CAPRA</u>, <u>CoR</u>, <u>D&E</u>, and <u>FWAF</u> endorsed or otherwise supported the revisions.

VII. D & E Memo of Support for VPF Efforts on Behalf of LGBTQ Faculty - D&E Member Chin
