### A. Presidential Unmanned Aircraft System (UAS) Policy- CoR Chair Noelle

Members are asked to discuss committee comments on the draft <u>Presidential Unmanned Aircraft System (UAS) Policy</u>. As per the <u>accompanying cover letter</u>, the policy is intended to establish minimum standards for the safe use and operation of UAS and Small Unmanned Aircraft Systems (SUAS), including drones and model aircraft, on any University Location or at any Authorized University Activity. This policy requires that all UAS operations are performed in a manner that mitigates risks to safety, security, and privacy, and ensures compliance with the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) Modernization and Reform Act of 2012 (Public Law 112–95) and all applicable laws. CoR and Graduate Council are the lead committees for this review.
