	Α.	Incentive Plan for Revenue Generating Master's Degree Programs - GC Chair Balasubrama	

A. Incentive Plan for Revenue Generating Master's Degree Programs - GC Chair Balasubramaniam DivCo is asked to discuss committee comments on the <u>Incentive Plan for Revenue Generating</u> <u>Master's Degree Programs</u> submitted by VPDGE Zatz and Dean Matsumoto. GC and CAPRA were the lead committees for the review.

Action Requested: 1) Discuss committee comments. 2) Transmit Divisional Council's response to VPDGE Zatz and Dean Matsumoto.

Committee Comments:

- <u>CAPRA</u> noted that elements of the proposal had merit, while articulating five areas of concern that the committee believes should be addressed before the plan is initiated.
- <u>CoR</u> supports the proposed plan, pending clarification in five areas. Members also offered three recommendations.
- <u>GC</u> agreed the proposed plan would make a positive contribution to graduate education at UCM, but requested additional information, including regarding the

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sufficiency of the 50/25/25 split to support programs in implementing the plan and how the proposed plan will assist students in preparing for the workforce.

- <u>UCG</u> desired a description of potential consequences and challenges of the proposed initiative, including as relates to instructional planning; UGC also encouraged planning to clarify relationships with planning activities being undertaken by Extension.
- <u>School of Engineering Executive Committee</u> strongly supports the overall plan, and articulated four clarifying questions regarding what programs are eligible for participation in this revenue-sharing plan, how self-paying revenue is calculated, the relationship of this plan to potential SSP and PDST programs, and what if any restrictions apply to the use of funds generated through such an initiative.

Committees that declined to comment, but appreciated the opportunity to opine: CAP, CRE, D&E, and FWAF

V. SYSTEMWIDE REVIEW ITEMS

A. Presidential Policy for Establishing and Maintaining Policies – CRE Chair Tian DivCo is asked to discuss <u>CRE comments</u> on the proposed *Presidential Policy for Establishing and Maintaining Policies*. This systemwide policy outlines the current process for development and review of both new and existing policies and procedures, and is intended to provide clear and consistent guidance to all constituents for the process the University uses for policy development and review. The policy applies to all UC locations and offices developing and reviewing Presidential polices, but does not affect policy development, consultation, and maintenance of the Academic Personnel Manual.

Action Requested: 1) Discuss CRE's comments. 2) Transmit Divisional Council's response to Associate Chancellor Putney.

 PROPOSAL TO EMPANEL RESERVE CAP – CAP CHAIR LÓPEZ-CALVO & VPF CAMFIELD

- The UC Merced <u>administration approved</u> the proposal to discontinue the Service Sciences Minor.
- <u>In a letter to Vice Provost Carlson dated 12/16/2016</u>, Academic Senate Chair Chalfant summarized the results of the Academic Senate review of the proposed *Presidential Policy on International Activities*. Further revisions were requested in light of the significant concerns raised by Senate reviewers.
- <u>In a letter to Vice Provost Carlson dated 12/21/2016</u>, Academic Senate Chair Chalfant summarized the results of systemwide review of proposed amendments to APM 015 and 016, and noted that the Senate is unable to endorse them as written due to concerns about their clarity, intent, and effectiveness.
- <u>In a letter to President Napolitano date 12/21/2016</u>, Academic Senate Chair Chalfant communicated the Academic Council's resolution on non-resident enrollment.
- <u>In a letter to President Napolitano date 1/4/201</u>7, Academic Senate Chair Chalfant communicated the Academic Council's resolution on in-state tuition.
- On January 5, 2016, Chair Chalfant issued <u>a request for nominations</u> for the 2017-18 Chair of the Academic Council. The request has been circulated to all members of the Merced Division.
