- V. Posthumous Degree Awarding (GradDiv)
 - **a. Background**: VPDGE Zatz has been asked by the family of a recently deceased PhD candidate about the possibility of awarding a posthumous degree, and reached out to other UC Graduate Deans for their processes. In 2011, the G(R)C and UGC approved a policy for posthumous degree awards proposed by the Registrar and Vice Chancellor for Student Affairs. After recent review, this policy will require updating.
 - **b. Action**: GC to review policy and revise as appropriate.

VI. Best Practices regarding Senior PhD Students to Teach Upper Level Courses

- a. Background: In December 2016, a CSE faculty member contacted the Graduate Division and UGC Chair to request an exception be provided so that a senior Ph.D. student could teach an upper level course, due to the inability to find a suitable Lecturer. Per GC policy, graduate students may teach upper level undergraduate courses, but may not have TAs, as that would place the instructing student into a supervisory role. An exception was granted in this specific instance, emphasizing that the grad student instructor would not have supervisory nor evaluative authority over the teaching assistants. GC is asked to formalize best practices for handling this issue in the future.
- **b. Action:** GC to discuss and develop best practices to govern instruction by graduate students.

VII. Extension Course Approval Process

- **a. Background:** UC Merced Extension is planning to offer for-credit courses (1 and 2 unit) starting in Summer of 2017. As lead committee, GC is asked to develop a policy covering the assessment and evaluation of these courses and programs.
- **b. Action:** GC to discuss and provide feedback to GC Chair.
- VIII. SOE EC Memo to GC Concerning Graduate Admissions Policies

- **a. Background:** The SOE Executive Committee has requested GC review and act upon three factors to grow the School's graduate population and to contribute to UC Merced attaining Carnegie classification as an R1 institution.

The revisions to this policy are intended to make systemwide policy more "family friendly", by allowing reimbursement, in limited circumstances, for travel (including childcare) expenses for spouses, domestic partners, dependent-care providers, and dependents of employees traveling on University business and candidates for employment at the University of California traveling to UC locations for recruitment purposes.
