## III. Consultation with Provost/EVC Camfield – 20 min

The Provost will join members of D&E at 10:10am to discuss the following items:

- A. Academic Personnel Alterations to the merit promotion system.
- B. Diversity in Faculty Hiring UCAADE data has revealed that the percentage of faculty from underrepresented groups hired by Merced has decreased in the last year from the previous year. D&E to discuss ways of empowering the FEA program, in collaboration with campus academic leadership, so that the candidate pools and short-lists are representative of the diversity that is available in the fields.

### IV. Guidelines for Faculty Retention – 15 min

This topic was previously discussed by D&E. It was agreed that members would revise the guidelines in a way that more accurately addresses the systemic reasons why faculty separate from the university. Former Provost/EVC Peterson drafted guidelines last year for the Senate's review. Several committees, including D&E, had critical comments. D&E's AY 17-18 memo can be viewed <u>here</u>.

Action Requested: Members propose revisions to the guidelines. Once members agree on a set of guidelines, a draft will be sent to DivCo and to the EVC for comments.

### V. Campus Review Items – 15 min

A. Proposed Teaching and Preparation Program, Distance Education

University Extension submitted a proposal to establish a distance education version of the non-degree program *UC Merced Extension Teacher Preparation Program, Multiple Subject Credential and Single Subject Credential.* The onsite version of this program was approved by the Senate in April 2018.

The policy governing the establishment of a non-degree program by Extension is <u>here</u>. As per section II.C. of the policy, the Senate is asked to consider the following when reviewing a proposal for a non-degree program put forth by Extension: *Senate Committee members should ask questions if there are concerns about the credibility of* 

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a content area, intended audience, or selection of courses to be included in a non-degree program, or resource impacts on existing (non-Extension) academic programs.

The new course requests (CRFs) for distance education versions of existing courses will be reviewed concurrently by Graduate Council.

## D&E is not a lead reviewer.
