IV. **Summer Fellowships**

Each graduate group has been assigned a percentage of the Summer Fellowship funding based on the number of graduate students in each group. There are 256 active graduate students on campus. The committee set aside \$250k for these awards. There is an additional \$51.8k (less \$750 for TA awards) held over from last year to equal a total of \$301k in available funds.

Action: Review the rankings and determine the cut off lines. Award and Decline letters will be sent to students by March 19.

V. **Faculty Grants**

\$123k is available for distribution. Thirty-five faculty members submitted proposals for the Faculty Research Grants totaling \$192,192 in funding requests. **Action:** Review and approve the final rankings for the grant awards.

VIII. Graduate Advisors Handbook Revision

CCGA and ALO Martin have found nothing controversial with revising the course requirements for MA/MS degrees in the Graduate Advisor's Handbook "Plan I (Thesis)

"In addition to the thesis, a minimum of 24 semester units in approved courses is also required, at least <u>50%</u> of which must be earned in 200 series graduate-level courses <u>exclusive of courses numbered from 295-299</u>. A general examination is also required.

"Plan II (Comprehensive Examination)

"In addition to the comprehensive examination, a minimum of 30 semester units in approved courses, at least 50% of which must be from graduate-level courses in the 200 series exclusive of courses numbered from 295-299."

Action: Discuss and approve the proposed revision.
