### I. Context

The purpose of this policy is to clarify the procedure for starting a term under ECC.

### II. Policy text

---

Extension of Emergency Course Continuity at the beginning of a term requires approval by the Divisional Council.

Emergency Course Continuity can be invoked for as much as 5 weeks (25 days of instruction).

Emergency Course Continuity may be extended for as many as four (4), 5-week intervals at one time.
