VII. Library and Scholarly Communications Bylaw Revisions

The proposed revisions increase the faculty membership of the committee to five from four, and change the composition of the committee to being broadly representative of the schools (and populated by the Committee on Committees) from being composed of a representative each from the Committee on Academic Planning and Resource Allocation, the Committee on Research, Graduate Council and Undergraduate Council. Additionally, the Chief Information Officer (CIO) has been removed as an exofficio member, at the CIO's request. Finally, a small revision has been made to <u>bylaw II.IV.4.B.2</u> addressing the committee's role in the Library's budget.

A. <u>Proposed Revised Presidential Policy on Native American Cultural Affiliation and Repatriation</u> President Napolitano requested Provost Brown to convene a workgroup to substantively revise the existing Policy and Procedures on Curation and Repatriation of Human Remains and Cultural Items. The policy pertains to the treatment and repatriation of Native American and Native Hawaiian human remains and cultural items under the University's stewardship and the University's compliance with the federal Native American Graves Protection and Repatriation Act (NAGPRA).
