#### **Committee Comments:**

- <u>CAPRA</u> continues to support elements of the plan, but concluded the revised plan did
  not address the potential impact on undergraduate programs. CAPRA also made two
  requests regarding current and future proposals.
- <u>CoR</u> generally supports the revised plan, while identifying three issues that could benefit from further attention.
- <u>GC</u> endorsed the revised plan with the condition that carryover of incentive funds is automatically allowable.
- <u>School of Engineering Executive Committee</u> strongly supports the plan, and strongly desires its immediate implementation.
- <u>EECS program</u> describes how the plan does not treat fairly programs like EECS that successfully grown following encouragement to do so.
