#### **Committee Comments:**

- GC recommended revisions addressing financial sustainability, curriculum, involvement of the humanities, and the academic sustainability goal.
- UGC offered comments related to curriculum and community engagement.
- <u>Cor</u> suggested adding descriptions of organizations involved in pursuing the plan's goals, and encouraged analysis of the resources required to pursue sustainability goals.
- <u>CAPRA</u> endorsed the principles outlined in this plan, but desired discussion of the resources being allocated to meet the objectives and the net costs to the campus relative to alternative resource allocations.
- NSEC recommended reconciliation of the definitions of the Sustainability Strategic Plan
