V. Campus Review Items

A. Proposed Revisions to Policy for Posthumous Baccalaureate Degrees – UGC Chair Sharping Members are asked to discuss committee comments on revisions to the campus's policy for awarding posthumous baccalaureate degrees proposed by Undergraduate Council. The proposed revisions follow a request from Academic Council for campuses to review their policies in light of a model policy developed by the University Committee on Education Policy (UCEP). Lead committees for this review are GC and the school executive committees. Deans, the Vice Chancellor for Student Affairs, and the Registrar were also invited to comment.

Action Requested: Determine next steps.

Committee Comments:

- <u>CRE</u> recommends clarifying the policy's text to indicate that baccalaureate degrees
 are to be awarded posthumously, not "posthumous baccalaureate degrees," as
 stated in the text.
- <u>GC</u> recommends revising "who will" to "who may" in footnote 1 and restoring the language in footnote 1 to the text of bullet point 2.
- <u>Dean Matsumoto</u> recommends a policy be considered regarding the degree award semester and which commencement announcement/program the student name is listed.
- VCSA suggested the policy designate the campus's designated point of contact as
 the individual who will work with the student's family regarding the awarding of the
 degree in cases when the review is not initiated by the family.

ACADEMIC SENATE -MERCED DIVISION

- VPDUE supported comments by Dean Matsumoto and the VSCA.
- SoE EC recommends explicit language providing latitude for the timing of degree conferral, following family consultation.
- SSHA EC recommended that UGC approve recommendations for a posthumous degrees to be conferred on undergraduates not in their final semester.

Committees and administrators that declined to comment, but appreciated the opportunity to opine: CAP, CAPRA, CoR, D&E, FWAF, and Registrar.

B. Principles to Guide the Conduct of Executive Session – CRE Chair Viney Members are asked to discuss committee comments on the proposed Principles to Guide the Conduct of Executive Session. The proposed principles and associated practices are intended to establish for committee members, consultants, guests, and the broader community, a set of expectations for how executive sessions are conducted, and to promote consistency in the implementation of executive sessions across Senate committees. An endorsed, final version will be posted to the Senate website. There were no lead committees for this review.

Action Requested: Determine next steps.

Committee Comments:

- CRE recommends clarifying apparently contradictory statements about minutes in executive session.
- D&E endorses the principles.
- FWAF endorses the principles.
- GC unanimously endorsed the document, noting that principles and associated practices do not in any way abrogate or otherwise restrict committee rights to undertake executive sessions
- UGC endorsed the principles.
- SoE EC does not support the document.
- SSHA EC supported that policy decisions made in Executive Session be shared with all committee members, but was not entirely clear about the meaning of the comment in principle 3 that decisions made in Executive session be reported in more than one format.

Committees that declined to comment, but appreciated the opportunity to opine: CAP, CAPRA, and CoR.

The revisions would reduce the minimum of units of approved courses required for a master's degree by comprehensive exam (Plan II) from 30 to 24 and, commensurately, from 24 to 20 the number of units which must be from graduate-level courses in the 200 series.
