	A. <u>Proposed Presidential Policy on Open Access for Theses and Dissertations</u> – GC Chair Ghezzehei Members are asked to discuss committee comments on the <u>Proposed Presidential Policy on</u> <u>Open Access for Theses and Dissertations</u> . As per <u>the accompanying cover letter</u> , the proposed policy brings theses and dissertations into the overall framework of UC's other open access policies as, currently, there is no systemwide uniformity or policy ensuring open access to	

graduate students' theses and dissertations. GC, CoR, and LASC are the lead committees for this review.

Action Requested: Transmit Divisional Council's comments to the Senate Chair by March 14, 2018.

Committee Comments:

- <u>CAPRA</u> supports the policy, noting it will impose minimal burden on the VPDGE.
- <u>CoR</u> endorsed the proposed policy.
- <u>D&E</u> offered two recommendations: students be able to opt out of E-scholarship, with the provision that the work be available via another platform; the relationship of this new platform to any mandatory platform as designated by the School's Graduate Division, in UC Merced's case, ProQuest, be clarified.
- <u>GC</u> raised concerns about the policy, and made three related recommendations: extend the embargo period for up to six years; offer students the option to opt out of the requirement; and revise the embargo-extension language to be less intimidating.
- <u>LASC</u> supports the proposed policy, but recommends an option to extend the embargo for up to six years.

Committees that declined to comment, but appreciated the opportunity to opine: CAP, CRE, FWAF, and UGC.

- <u>FWAF</u> endorsed the proposed revisions.
- <u>GC</u> endorsed the proposed revisions.
- <u>UGC</u> commented on the working title, limits on using the title in hiring, and teaching load.
