 B. <u>Proposed Carry Forward Policy</u> – CAPRA Chair Singhal Members are asked to discuss committee comments on the proposed <u>Carry Forward Policy</u>. CAPRA, CoR, and FWAF are the lead committees for this review. **Action Requeste**d: Transmit Divisional Council's comments to the Co-chairs of the Budget Work Group, Chief Financial and Administrative Officer Mendez and Senate Vice Chair Schnier.

Committee Comments:

- <u>CAPRA</u> offered several recommendations to promote equity across the schools and to clarify the policy.
- <u>Cor</u> views the policy favorably, but requested clarification on the application of carry forward policy to situations in which departments/units retain a portion of the incidental funds allocated to faculty.
- <u>D&E</u> supports the policy, but requested clarification regarding the relevance of the statement "All other funds considered for carry forward cannot exceed 5% of the current fiscal year non-salary allocation provided."
- <u>FWAF</u> approves the policy, but had two questions, one addressing the possibility of petitions to exceed the \$9,000 limit and the second regarding the implications for faculty of the 5% limit on carry over for all other funds.
- <u>GC</u> did not raise any objections to the policy.
- <u>SoE Executive Committee</u> expressed no concerns about the policy.
- <u>SSHA Executive Committee</u> had no objection to its implementation.

Committees that declined to comment, but appreciated the opportunity to opine: CAP, CRE, and UGC

V. Proposed Campus Policy on Classroom Recordings - FWAF Chair Malloy FWAF has <u>drafted a policy</u> on student recording of classroom lecturers and presentations. The draft is adopted from a policy that is being implemented at UCSB.

Action Requested: Endorse the draft policy for transmittal to Chief Campus Counsel Elisabeth Gunther and Associate Chancellor Luanna Putney.

VI. Academic Freedom - FWAF Chair Malloy

FWAF <u>has drafted a statement</u> affirming the institution's support for faculty freedom of expression and the systems that govern such freedoms. The statement is intended for use by the administration in instances where faculty are subject to politically motivated questions about their work.

Action Requested: Endorse the draft policy for transmittal to Provost/EVC Peterson, VPF Camfield, Associate Chancellor Luanna Putney, and Chief External Relations Officer Ed Klotzbier.
