## **III.** Election 2019-2020

A. Spring Senate Election

#### V. Campus Review Items

A. <u>Revised Recommended Voting Policies in Academic Personnel Cases</u> – Chair Viney

The proposed guidelines were discussed at November 29<sup>th</sup> and December 10<sup>th</sup> CRE meetings. It was agreed that Chair Viney will work on revisions during the winter break. This will be followed by a consultation with the Committee on Faculty Welfare and Academic Freedom and the Committee for Diversity and Equity.

- B. <u>Policy for the Establishment of New Schools/Colleges</u> *Vice Chair Anna Song* The proposed <u>Policy for the Establishment of New Schools/Colleges</u>. The policy establishes campus-level procedures for the development and review of proposals for new schools or colleges together with a standard proposal format. In doing so, it functions as a companion to the <u>Compendium</u> (p.18), which outlines the policy and procedure at the system level.

Action Requested: Members discuss the proposed revisions and Vice Chair's comments. CRE's comments on the policy are due to DivCo by January 16, 2019.

C. <u>Proposal to Change Name of Social Sciences and Management Academic Unit</u> – *Chair Viney* The SSM unit seeks to change the program's name from "Social Sciences and Management" to "Economics and Business Management" to better reflect the content of the reorganized program's research and teaching. Feedback from committees will be consideration by DivCo at its February 20, 2019 meeting. Action Requested: Members discuss the proposed revisions to the program name and send comments to DivCo by February 13, 2019.

D. <u>Proposal to Change Title from L(P)SOE to Teaching Professor</u> – Christine Isborn The proposed policy seeks to change the title of Lecturers (P) with Security of Employment to "Teaching Professor" to reflect their contributions to the campus community.

Action Requested: Members are to discuss member Isborn's comments. Committee's comments are due to DivCo by February 13, 2019.

A. <u>Second Review of Proposed Presidential Policy for Open Access for Theses and Dissertations</u> – Lead TBD

Members are asked to discuss the revised proposed Presidential Policy for Open Access for Theses and Dissertations. #### B. Proposed Revisions to Senate Bylaw 336 - Lead Reviewer TBD

Members are asked to discuss the proposed revision to Senate Bylaw 336 which focuses on the Committee of Privilege and Tenure's handling of disciplinary cases. Specific changes include the process by which Sexual Harassment and Sexual Violence are reviewed.

Action Requested: Members assign a lead reviewer. Reviewer's comments will be discussed at the February 13 CRE meeting. CRE's comments are due to DivCo by February 25, 2019.

#### C. <u>Proposed revisions to Part IV. Section II: Master's Degree Requirements of the Merced Division</u> <u>Regulations</u> – *Lead Reviewer TBD*

The proposal is to reduce the minimum of units of approved courses required by a master's degree by comprehensive exam (Plan II) from 30 to 24 and commensurately, to reduce from 24 to 20 the number of units which must be from graduate-level courses in the 200 series. These changes seek to make masters degrees at UC Merced commensurate to those offered at other UC campuses.

Action Requested: Members assign a lead reviewer. Reviewer's comments will be discussed at the February 13<sup>th</sup> CRE meeting in time. CRE's comments are due to DivCo by February 25.

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D. <u>Revisions to the Principles to Guide the Conduct of Executive Session</u> - Chair Viney

The Divisional Council reviewed CRE members' comments to the proposed revised policy and sought to address them. The revised policy will be available on the UC Merced Academic Senate website after CRE approval.
