### V. <u>Public Health Degree Title Change</u> – Graduate Council Chair Westerling

5 Min

On December 6, 2018, <u>Graduate Council approved</u> the request from the Public Health Graduate Group to revise the program's master's degree title to Master of Science in Public Health (MSPH) from an M.S. in Public Health (M.S. in PH). The MSPH degree title was used throughout the CCGA proposal, although not on the proposal's title page. The result is that all approval documents, including those from CCGA and Presidential Napolitano, refer to the degree as an M.S. in Public Health, rather than the desired MSPH. This request seeks to address this error. The MSPH would constitute a new degree title for the campus, as such Divisional Council is asked to explicitly approve the adoption of this new degree title.

Actions Requested: 1) Approve the proposed master's degree title change to MSPH from M.S. in PH, 2) approve the adoption of the MSPH degree title, and 3) transmit approvals to the administration.

# VI. D&E Award for Diversity – D&E Chair Nobile

The Committee for Diversity and Equity has proposed a <u>new Senate Award for Contributions to</u> <u>Diversity</u>. The EVC/Provost has agreed to fund the award at \$1,000, the standard amount for Senate awards.
