A. Extension Proposal for Distance Education Teacher Preparation Program – GC Chair Westerling Members are asked to discuss <u>committee comments</u> on <u>the proposal</u> from University Extension to establish a distance education version of the non-degree program UC Merced Extension Teacher Preparation Program, Multiple Subject Credential and Single Subject Credential. On March 26, Extension communicated revisions to the total number of units required for the non-degree program. GC and CAPRA are the lead committees for this review.

Requested Action: Endorse the proposal and transmit the Senate's approval to AVC and Extension Dean Orcutt.
