A. Proposed Revisions to Senate Regulation 479 (Cal-GETC)

The proposed revisions aim to enhance transfer student preparedness, especially in high-unit majors where <u>Associate Degrees for Transfer (ADTs)</u> that fully align with <u>UC's Transfer Pathways</u> have not yet been developed because including the essential courses for UC major preparation would exceed the state-legislated ADT unit cap (60 maximum lower-division units).

UGC is a lead reviewer.

Requested Action: Identify a lead reviewer. The lead reviewer will send their assessment to the UGC Analyst by October 15, 2024. Voting members will be invited to review the draft memo prior to transmittal to the Senate Chair. **Comments due to the Senate Chair:** October 25, 2024.

B. Proposed New Senate Regulation 627 (Posthumous Awarding of Degrees)

The regulation introduces a Senate policy to govern the awarding of undergraduate and graduate degrees to students who pass away prior to their completion of the degree.

A. End of Term Policy

During the September 13, 2024 UGC meeting, members briefly discussed whether an End of Term Policy should be implemented to require the last week of instruction as a study week each semester where no new materials are presented to students. Members also discussed how many faculty misinterpret UGC's policy for online modality and convert their in-person classes to Zoom following Thanksgiving.

UC Merced policies for minors and double majors During the September 13, 2024 UGC meeting, members discussed <u>PROC's memo</u>, which recommended a review of UC Merced's current policies to identify any obstacles that might make completing a minor or double major more difficult for UC Merced students than students at other institutions.
