III. Proposed Revisions to Senate Bylaw II.III.2.A. (CAP) – Chair Viney {1:25-1:40pm}

Per CRE's request on October 25, 2023 and recent ruling, CAP discussed possible revisions to Senate Bylaw II.III.2.A. – CAP.

IV. <u>Implementation of Senate Regulation 630.E</u> – Laura Hamilton, Professor and Chair of Sociology {1:40-2:00pm}

Professor and Chair of Sociology Laura Hamilton is representing UC Merced faculty on the UC Systemwide Taskforce on Online Education and will attend the meeting to introduce this topic.

In February 2023, the Academic Senate adopted Senate Regulation 630.E, which created a "campus experience" requirement that students must complete in order to earn an undergraduate degree, which had the effect of precluding the creation of any fully online undergraduate degrees by campuses and preventing any individual students, with the exception of incarcerated students, from being able to obtain an undergraduate degree by enrolling only in online classes. The campus experience requirement in SR 630.E requires enrollment in a minimum number of units in courses with at least 50 percent in-person instruction.

On February 14, 2024, the Board of Regents rejected the amendment to Senate Regulation 630.E. The video of the full Board's discussion can be found here. The written summary can be found here. A

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redacted digest of the Board's discussion, in the form of a <u>video memo</u>, has been prepared by UCEP Chair Melanie Cocco; it includes Chair Cocco's informative commentary about the background to the Regulation and the vote.

This item will be introduced during the March 11, 2024 DivCo meeting.
