There have been inquiries concerning the processes for center review and for proposing a new core facility. <u>Current UCM Academic Senate policy</u> on this matter is insufficiently detailed to guide the review process or to specify the requirements for a core facility proposal. Three members have begun the process of modifying the policy, beginning with the section on centers and core facilities, as COR has pending business in these areas. The Committee agreed that the section on centers should be revised to state that COR will, at the time of a center's establishment, decide whether it is to participate in the center's five-year reviews. Using the proposed revisions to the sections on centers and core facilities as a guide, COR will then modify the section on ORUS.

Benefits provided under the Policy are subject to a two-year lifetime limit. The proposed revisions renew the current Policy for a four-year period, effective July 1, 2018 through June 30, 2022. FWAF is a lead reviewer.
