Committee on Research (CoR) Minutes of Meeting May 2, 2022

Pursuant to call, the Committee on Research met at 10:30 am – 12:00 pm on May 2, 2022 via Zoom. Chair Jason Sexton presiding.

I. Consultation with Interim CFO Kurt Schnier

Interim CFO Schnier shared updates on the various issues surrounding the Oracle financial system. He has contacted the Controller and Assistant Controller for their input and the Controller is also meeting with the SPO director. He explained that once his division receives the terms and conditions of a faculty award from Contract & Grant Administration, his staff create an account which involves multiple places that have to be activated across the module. Interim CFO Schnier is trying to mitigate the communication issues to the RAs so they have the correct information.

A CoR member pointed out that the ticket system is inefficient. For example, when trying to get a partial tax rate for capital purchases, each ticket takes two days and the subsequent action often is to request that the user make a change and resubmit the ticket which delays the process further.

CoR members and Interim CFO Schnier agreed that the piecemeal/one-off strategy to problem solving is untenable. Interim CFO Schnier suggested that the campus needs to consider the larger issue of service delivery in addition to specific problems of the Oracle financial system. A possible solution is to expand the scope of the Oracle Advisory Committee to address the larger issue of service delivery on campus and OIT strategies.

Interim CFO Schnier asked CoR members to help him prioritize a list of improvements that he can address with the administration.

- II. Chair's Report Chair Sexton
 - A. April 21 Divisional Council meeting
 - Senate Chair Westerling announced that EVC/Provost Camfield issued a letter to the School deans recently regarding increased allocations for new faculty hires. Allocations are increased for household moving expenses, professional office moves, house hunting trips, and MOP Loans.
 - VCSA Nies gave a presentation on the Campus and Community Safety Plan.
 - LASC Chair DePrano updated Divisional Council on UCOLASC business. Academic Council recently endorsed UCOLASC's statement that asked UCOP

to permanently reinstate funding for the California Digital Library Collections budget.

- VPDUE Frey gave a presentation on the impact of remote instruction on students. The lack of engagement of students is concerning.
