### A. Policy for the Establishment of New Schools/Colleges - Lead TBD

The policy establishes campus-level procedures for the development and review of proposals for new schools or colleges together with a standard proposal format. In doing so, it functions as a companion to the <u>*Compendium*</u> (p.18), which outlines the policy and procedure at the system level.

Actions Requested: Members briefly discuss the proposed policy, identify a lead for further discussion to take place at the 9 January 2019 CRE meeting, and transmit CRE's comments and/or endorsement to the Senate Chair by January 16<sup>th</sup>, 2019.

### B. Campus Space Planning Principles - Lead TBD

These Principles were developed by a representative working group, from all levels of the campus community including Senate faculty, appointed by the Space Allocation and Planning Board during the Spring of 2017. The draft document awaits formal consultation with the Academic Senate before being presented as a recommendation to the Chancellor.

Actions Requested: Members discuss the proposed principles and decide whether to opine. If opining, a lead reviewer will be identified. The lead reviewer's comments will be sent to CRE for review. Comments are due to the Senate Chair by December 21<sup>st</sup>, 2018.

President Napolitano's new Task Force on universitywide policies and processes include four major recommendations: a review of the procedures for which complaints are filed and investigated, the quality and consistency of training on the use of force, the post-incident review process, and community engagement.
