## **Emergency Course Continuity Policy**

Summary:	The Emergency Course Continuity policy specifies academic instruction policies which may be invoked in the event of an emergency that prevents or limits the campus's ability to deliver standard undergraduate and graduate instruction.  Emergency Course Continuity provides instructional flexibility to the instructors of record and teaching assistants for courses in progress at the time of emergency declaration. Instructors of record may deliver their courses using online modalities without obtaining approval through the standard process for online course approval. This policy also provides guidelines for adjusting contact hours and adjustments to course learning outcomes.	
	Emergency Course Continuity may be invoked by the Chancellor and/or the Provost in consultation with the Chair of the Academic Senate (or their designees, if unavailable), and may last up to 5 weeks (25 days of instruction).	
	Extension of Emergency Course Continuity requires approval by the Merced Divisional Council.

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## I. POLICY TEXT

The Emergency Course Continuity policy specifies academic instruction policies which, in the event of an emergency, may be invoked by the Chancellor and/or the EVC/Provost, in consultation with the Chair of the Academic Senate (or their designees, if unavailable).

This policy outlines course-related activities which are *permitted* without prior approval from the <u>Undergraduate Council</u> (UGC) and/or the <u>Graduate Council</u> (GC) during such emergencies. *It does not specify that instructors of record are obligated to adopt these alternative activities.* 

Emergency Course Continuity provides instructional flexibility to the instructors of record and teaching assistants for courses in progress at the time of emergency declaration.

- Instructors of record may deliver their courses using online modalities without obtaining approval through the standard UGC and/or GC process for online course approval.
- Teaching assistants are permitted, without obtaining prior UGC and GC approval through the standard approval process, to perform course delivery responsibilities in the event that the instructor of record cannot deliver the course. Department chairs and school deans must adhere to established workload and labor policies when making these assignments.
- Instructors of record may shift to asynchronous instruction modalities without obtaining prior UGC and/or GC approval through the standard approval process.

Emergency Course Continuity provides flexibility to adjust coursework and evaluation provided students have 48-hour advance notice.

- Instructors of record may alter assignment submission formats to accommodate distance learning.
- Instructors of record may assign take-home tests/quizzes/midterms in place of inperson versions.
- Instructors of record may assign take-home final exams in place of in-person exams in the event that the Emergency Course Continuity designation extends throughout the exam week period.

Emergency Course Continuity allows for adjusting contact hours without prior UGC and/or GC approval. In all cases, 30% cumulative reduction in contact hours is permissible.

Emergency Course Continuity provides flexibility in meeting course learning objectives.

• Faculty may explore alternative means of achieving the learning objectives that are covered in a course.

Emergency Course Continuity can be invoked for as much as 5 weeks (25 days of instruction).

Extension of Emergency Course Continuity beyond 5 weeks requires approval by the Merced Divisional Council.
