The Graduate Professional Advancement Initiative (PAI) is a professional development initiative for UC Merced graduate students, launched in fall 2013. Using an across-campus collaborative approach, Graduate Student Services established the Graduate PAI steering committee whose charge is to facilitate a campus dialogue aimed at supporting the development of professional skills into graduate training. There is no current funding for this initiative. However, Graduate Student Services submitted a budget request to the Student Fee Advisory Committee to fund this initiative. The steering committee anticipates that most of the workshops, courses, seminars, etc. will be instructed by current staff and/or faculty at UC Merced.
