# **Committee Highlights**

The Committee on Academic Personnel (CAP) is conducting business as usual.

<u>The Committee on Academic Planning and Resource Allocation</u> (CAPRA) transmitted the Call for FTE requests to the Provost/EVC.

<u>The Committee on Faculty Welfare and Academic Freedom</u> (FWAF) will be consulting with the administration on after-school, holiday, and summer childcare this spring.

<u>The Committee on Research</u> (COR) is revising its policy for establishing Organized Research Units (ORUs), as well as the campus' limited submission procedures.

<u>Graduate Council</u> (GC) discussed with Graduate Associate Dean Kello revisions to the fellowship review process and commented on the proposed Policy for the Establishment of New Schools/Colleges.

<u>The Committee on Rules and Elections</u> (CRE) commented on the President's Task Force Recommendations on Universitywide Policing and the Campus Space Management Principles. This spring, CRE will revise the proposed guidelines for Voting in Academic Personnel Cases and conduct the Senate's annual elections.

<u>The Committee on Diversity and Equity</u> (D&E) opined on the proposed Policy for the Establishment of New Schools/Colleges. The committee also met with Faculty Equity Advisors to discuss the status of faculty hires. In January, D&E will discuss a proposal for faculty retention.

The Committee on Library and Scholarly Communications has no updates.

The Undergraduate Council (UGC) commented on the Campus Space Management Principles and the proposed Policy for the Establishment of New Schools/Colleges. UGC has reviewed 21 courses eligible for GE Badges. This spring, a UGC subcommittee will draft a proposal for a Review, Reading, and Recitation period.

<u>Divisional Council</u> (DivCo) approved for campus review proposed revisions to Part IV. Section II: Master's Degree Requirements of the <u>Merced Division Regulations</u>. DivCo is considering the role of school executive committee chairs vis-a-vis DivCo meetings.
