# **Committee Highlights**

The Committee on Academic Personnel (CAP) is conducting business as usual.

<u>The Committee on Academic Planning and Resource Allocation</u> (CAPRA) consulted with Associate Provost for Academic Planning and Budget, Kurt Schnier, on campus budget guidelines.

<u>The Committee on Faculty Welfare and Academic Freedom</u> (FWAF) advised the Associate Vice Provost for Faculty, Zulema Valdez, on the new peer mediation program.

The Committee on Research (COR) is finalizing the revised Organized Research Unit (ORU) policy and working on a research enhancement proposal.

<u>The Graduate Council</u> (GC), along with UGC and key campus stakeholders, is discussing proposed changes to the CRF process and Curriculog, as well as a proposal to auto-populate required policy information in CatCourses, all of which are intended to reduce faculty and staff workloads.

The Committee on Rules and Elections (CRE) is preparing the materials for this year's election. The Call for Nominations will be issued on January 14, 2020. CRE members are also reviewing the Proposed Revisions to APM - 120, Emerita/Emeritus Titles and will provide comments to DivCo by the January 27 deadline.

The Committee on Diversity and Equity (D&E) finalized revisions to the Faculty Retention Feasibility Assessment, following consultation with DivCo. D&E has also reviewed a draft plan for integrating diversity considerations in program review activities, and will recommend to the Periodic Program Oversight Committee (PROC), UGC, and GC the inclusion of the proposed plan in self-studies. D&E also reviewed comments from Faculty Equity Advisors (FEAs) on a checklist proposed by D&E.

The Undergraduate Council (UGC) approved six courses and the proposal for a B.S. Degree in Civil Engineering, effective Fall 2021. The Civil Engineering proposal will be discussed by the Senate leadership on January 22. In the spring, UGC will finalize the Reading/Review/Recitation Week (RRR) policy and the Entry Level Writing Requirement (ELWR) policy.

<u>Divisional Council</u> approved for consideration at the spring Meeting of the Division conformational revisions to Division Regulation <u>Part II. 2. A Residency Requirement</u>. DivCo also endorsed a proposal to establish the <u>Admissions and Financial Aid Subcommittee</u> of Undergraduate Council as a standalone committee and asked UGC, in consultation with CRE, to draft committee bylaws.
