### II. Consultation with University Librarian – Haipeng Li

A. Update on the budget reduction process

University Librarian Li provided an update on the timeline for the budget reduction process, noting that the final recommendations will be submitted to the Chancellor by May 8, 2025.

Regarding Library hours, University Librarian Li mentioned that plans for the next fiscal year have yet to be determined, and the final recommendations remain uncertain.

University Librarian Li also reported that the Library is cutting its tier 1 titles, which will have an impact on both faculty research and student learning. The proposed list of titles to be cut will be discussed during the May 1, 2025 LASC meeting. In response to a question from a LASC member about whether there is a process in place to notify faculty in advance of the subscriptions and titles being cut, University Librarian Li explained that the Library will collaborate with liaisons to reach out to their respective departments and inform faculty accordingly.

The Collaboratory for Indigenous Data Governance, in partnership with its collaborators, will host two webinars in April 2025 to deepen researchers' understanding of Indigenous data practices.
