GC Policy Subcommittee met and agreed that there needs to be a policy that applies to both upper and lower division courses where graduate student TAs assist graduate student IORs. VII. Discussion Item: 4+1 Program Policy and Procedure (3:10-3:20)

Following a proposal from MBSE in Summer 2020, draft 4+1 program <u>policy</u> and <u>guidelines</u> for program proposal were revised in Fall 2020. Members are invited to review the documents to finalize them at this meeting. Points to consider are:

- Additional Requirements that do not accrue course credits but provide professional development
- Minimum Grade (B-) and GPA (3.4 for all courses, 3.25 for courses in students' majors)
- Admissions as Freshman (with High School GPA of 3.6 or higher)
- Contiguous vs. Combined Programs (in Guidelines—this has policy and resource implications)
- Proposal Timeline (proposed 9 months vs. current 18 months for undergraduate proposals)
