IV. Request from SSHA – Proposal to Revise the ECON Major

- a. Cancel cross-listing of Econ 100 (Intermediate Macroeconomics) and Econ 101 (Intermediate Macroeconomics).
- b. Change the program's Statistics requirement to require Econ 10 (rather than the choice between Econ 10, Poli Sci 10, Soc 10, and Psych 10).
- c. Revise Econ 161 to be titled International Finance (from International Macroeconomics). This change better reflects the content of this course, and repositioning title to stress more exchange rate determination and risk management (topics of International Macroeconomics) makes the course a natural component of the program's Finance and Strategy track.
- d. Revise title of Econ 141 to reflect actual title and content.
