Note to UGC: Conjoined courses are those courses that are taught concurrently as both an advanced upper division undergraduate and an introductory graduate course. As per SR 762, undergraduate and graduate versions of conjoined courses "must have clearly differentiated and unique performance criteria, requirements, and goals." Each course that is conjoined with another course must have its own CRF that indicates the corresponding conjoined course. The graduate version of the course must be reviewed and approved by GC. (per undergraduate policy)
